The First Lesson: Acts 1:15-17, 21-26

The Holy Bible; NRSV, p. 993

Commentary: The disciples had a growing realization of the profound privilege and responsibility conferred upon them, to tell the world about Jesus. The person chosen to take Judas' place had to be as qualified for this ministry as the other eleven, someone taught and trained by Jesus, someone who had shared His life and work. Having been a witness to Jesus' resurrection was especially important. Two men, apparently equally qualified, were proposed and the disciples prayed for God to show them which one He chose. Then they cast lots and the Lord indicated Matthias as His sovereign choice to fulfill the apostolic ministry.

In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred twenty persons) and said, "Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus-- for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry. So one of the men who have accompanied us during all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us-- one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection." So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed and said, "Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place." And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles.

The Epistle: 1 John 5:9–13

NRSV, p. 1114

Commentary: During Jesus' earthly ministry, God at times bore witness to His Son (for two examples, see Matthew 3:17 and John 12:28). Additionally, God testifies to the truth regarding Jesus Christ through the Holy Spirit. If a person does not believe the Spirit's testimony, he is saying God has lied. This is the content of God's testimony: Jesus Christ and eternal life, together, are one gift that comes from God. Assurance of salvation rests on God's promise, not on human works. We can be sure we have eternal life if we have placed our faith in the Lord Jesus Christ.

If we receive human testimony, the testimony of God is greater; for this is the testimony of God that he has testified to his Son. Those who believe in the Son of God have the testimony in their hearts. Those who do not believe in God have made him a liar by not believing in the testimony that God has given concerning his Son. And this is the testimony: God gave us eternal life, and this life is in his Son. Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life. I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may know that you have eternal life.

name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one. While I was with them, I protected them in your name that you have given me. I guarded them, and not one of them was lost except the one destined to be lost, so that the scripture might be fulfilled. But now I am coming to you, and I speak these things in the world so that they may have my joy made complete in themselves. I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. I am not asking you to take them out of the world, but I ask you to protect them from the evil one. They do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth."




