

The First Lesson: Ruth 3:1-5; 4:13-17

The Holy Bible; NRSV, p. 240

Commentary: Naomi had not had an easy life. She moved to Moab with her husband and two sons to escape famine in Judah. Naomi's husband died and her sons married Moabite women. One of Naomi's daughters-in-law was named Ruth. After about ten years, both of Naomi's sons died and she decided to return to Judah. She urged her daughters-in-law to go back to their homes with the expectation that they could find new husbands and have families of their own. Instead, Ruth chose to accompany Naomi to Judah. Naomi hoped that God would bless Ruth and provide a husband for her. Because Boaz, Naomi's kinsman, had shown an interest in Ruth, Naomi decided to encourage that relationship. The plan that Naomi proposed was in harmony with Israel's laws and customs. God provided a husband for Ruth, and also a son. Little did Ruth and Boaz realize that their son would be an important link in the ancestral line of Israel's greatest kings, David and Jesus Christ.

Naomi her mother-in-law said to Ruth, "My daughter, I need to seek some security for you, so that it may be well with you. Now here is our kinsman Boaz, with whose young women you have been working. See, he is winnowing barley tonight at the threshing floor. Now wash and anoint yourself, and put on your best clothes and go down to the threshing floor; but do not make yourself known to the man until he has finished eating and drinking. When he lies down, observe the place where he lies; then, go and uncover his feet and lie down; and he will tell you what to do." She said to her, "All that you tell me I will do."

So Boaz took Ruth and she became his wife. When they came together, the LORD made her conceive, and she bore a son. Then the women said to Naomi, "Blessed be the LORD, who has not left you this day without next-of-kin; and may his name be renowned in Israel! He shall be to you a restorer of life and a nourisher of your old age; for your daughter-in-law who loves you, who is more to you than seven sons, has borne him." Then Naomi took the child and laid him in her bosom, and became his nurse. The women of the neighborhood gave him a name, saying, "A son has been born to Naomi." They named him Obed; he became the father of Jesse, the father of David.

The Epistle: Hebrews 9:24-28

p. 1096

Commentary: In this passage, the author of Hebrews continued to examine the reasons why Jesus' priesthood is superior to anything formerly in place. Jesus Christ's ministry required a once-for-all, fully sufficient sacrifice. The unrepeatable action of Jesus, offering His own blood, was the ultimate sacrifice for sin, securing salvation for believers and granting them access into the very presence of God. Christ's death saved us from the sin's penalty. When Christ comes again, He will provide salvation from the presence of sin for His faithful followers.

Christ did not enter a sanctuary made by human hands, a mere copy of the true one, but he entered into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf. Nor was it to offer himself again and again, as the high priest enters the Holy Place year after year with blood that is not his own; for then he would have had to suffer again and again since the foundation of the world. But as it is, he has appeared once for all at the end of the age to remove sin by the sacrifice of himself. And just as it is appointed for mortals to die once, and after that the judgment, so Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin, but to save those who are eagerly waiting for him.

Celebrant and People






