From the Rector: Life in Community

"Let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together ... but encouraging one another."

Hebrews 10:24-25a)

Dear St. James Parish Family,

In June of 2023, the National Institutes of Health published the results of a study focusing on the abiding connections between community, personal health and well being. The findings of this study were neither ambiguous nor surprising: there is a direct correlation between a person's well-being and their relationships within a broader community. The study defined this sense of community as 'a feeling that members have of belonging, a feeling that members matter to one another and to the group, and a shared faith that members' needs will be met through their commitment to be together.' I find the survey to be a lovely reaffirmation of the words Paul wrote to the Hebrews (and you and me) 2000 years ago.

Wonderfully, we are blessed to live out the beauty of this definition every single day. Indeed, our community is one of faith and hope, strengthened by regular and sustainable moments of "meeting together" in worship, formation and service. We call this Church - our life together as the body of Christ, in relationship and in community.

On behalf of the St. James staff, program and ministry volunteers, I am delighted to share with you a robust and engaging invitation for the fall season of our "Life in Community" at St. James Parish. Please take the time to look through the variety of offerings, which include both Sunday mornings and opportunities throughout the week. Once again, there is a rich and diverse variety for your interest and engagement. Please include yourself. All are welcome!

We hope and pray our fall season will offer you opportunities for encouragement, and that you (and your family) will more deeply engage yourself in the life of our parish, as we strive toward love and good deeds, all to the glory of Jesus Christ our Lord.

We hear this offering at every service of the Eucharist. Do you ever stop to ask yourself "Why do I go to church?" I suspect the answers might have more in common than we might first believe. Consider these: for renewal; to seek forgiveness for something done or maybe not done; for the joy of friendship and fellowship; for the music or a good sermon. Whatever the answer, the greatest reward is simply being reminded of God's love for us, and to be reminded that He is always available when we seek Him.

On September 8th, we will once again gather as one in our beautiful downtown Sanctuary. Another season of serenity at Mount Lebanon Chapel will have passed as we welcome all to another year of spiritual growth. The opportunity to learn about the numerous missions at St. James and to get involved will be available. Every group at St. James Parish welcomes new volunteers. Even a couple of hours a month can be a big help and so rewarding. It is God's call to us to help others.

The Vestry held their retreat in early August. On Friday night, we heard a presentation by Laura Vinson, the director of the St. Mary's Health and Dental Clinic. Laura talked about the history of the Clinic, the services provided to their patients, and their current search for a new location. Your Vestry is very interested in looking for ways that SJP might assist the clinic in finding a new home to ensure its continuation and growth. Our older parishioners might recall our early support of Good Shepherd Ministries and its success. On Saturday morning of our retreat, Mary Evans led the vestry on a broad discussion on the miracle of church fundraising and encouraged us to create our "vision" for St. James. As we considered this vision, it became apparent that a thorough plan for the efficient use of our facilities is needed. We are already working on this need.

DO YOU KNOW ABOUT THE ST. JAMES FOUNDATION?

The St. James Parish Foundation was established in 2003 with the mission of supporting the needs of St. James Parish in perpetuity. The Foundation supports its mission by providing financial contributions, generously donated to the Parish, through targeted distributions for capital or specific campaign-related needs.



HOW DOES IT WORK?

The Foundation oversees more than \$4 million in assets. Historically, up to 4 percent of the assets are used annually to provide financial support for campus expenses such as the repair and replacement of the church roof, storm restoration, structural repairs, and operational expenses. Foundation investments are managed by an outside professional investment firm with concentrated efforts to appropriately manage and grow the Foundation assets. In addition, a Foundation committee works directly with the investment firm to monitor and report on the health of the Foundation assets to the board.

HOW CAN I GIVE?

Leave a lasting legacy for our church community. A Letter from the Director

Dear St. James Day School Families,

We are excited to welcome you to the 77th school year at St. James Day School! This year, we are introducing a new initiative to support our goals as a school community: the launch of our Annual Fund. This fund will help us enhance the level of education we provide to our students, aligned with our five-year plan.

Last year, we made a significant improvement by replacing the aging tables and chairs in all the classrooms. The difference is evident, especially in the toddler classrooms. Previously, the toddlers were using chairs that were too high, requiring assistance to sit and stand. Now, they can do this independently, and they have learned to stay seated while eating snacks and lunch. This new skill is particularly appreciated by the two-year-old teachers this year.

Our next goal is to replace the shelving in all the classrooms. Ms. Carla and Ms. Gail's classroom has been set up as a model for this initiative. The new shelving will allow children to access materials independently and will enable teachers to create proper learning centers by using the shelving as dividers. We envision our classrooms with the child at the center.


